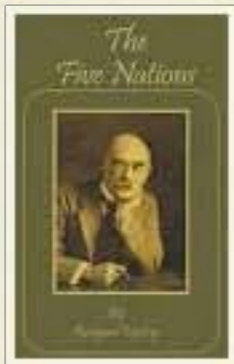

## WITH THE NIGHT MAIL

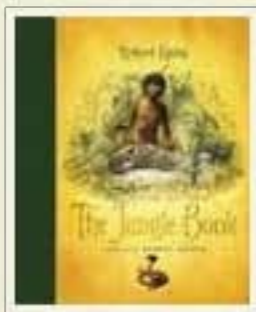
In The Windsor Magazine Vol. XXIII Dec. 1905-May 1906.

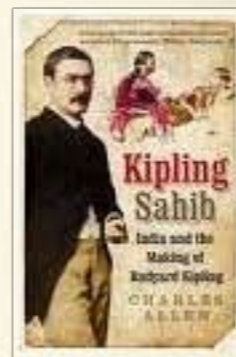
## THE DEFINITIVE EDITION OF RUDYARD KIPLING'S VERSE

of 4 1/2"x6". 302pp. Rather crudely bound in a maroon cloth binding. Hinge has been split but re-glued, paper edges a little browned. Normally we would not consider this of suitable interest for the catalogue, but it is a rather unusual association item connected with Kipling's well known biographer, Charles Carrington. Inside the front cover, loosely tipped-in with stamp edging is the original paper front wrapper with Carrington's signature and the date "15-4-23 Baveno". On the reverse of this is the inscription "presented to C.E.C. by his grateful and affectionate Aunt Mavis on the occasion of his saving her life at Baveno, April 21 1923".
